

Coweta County SPLOST Projects

Central Community Center

The Central Community Center and Advance Voting Site provides rental space for community activities and is the second Early Voting location in Coweta County.

Cost: \$770,000



Central Library

Completed in 2008, Central Library was the first new library built in Coweta County in over two decades.

Cost: \$6,200,000 (SPLOST) + \$2,000,000 (Grant)



Central Sports Complex

Central Soccer Complex, completed in 2014, serves the Coweta soccer community by providing up to 22 soccer fields to serve a variety of age groups. This facility has become more heavily relied upon over the past couple of years as participation in our soccer programs has increased. In addition, the complex features a walking trail, fitness equipment, pavilion and a playground.

Cost: \$980,000 (SPLOST) + \$1.2M (Impact Fees)



Emergency Operation Center (EOC) & Call Center Expansion

EMA is the legal coordinating entity for large scale, man-made and natural disasters. During the EF4 tornado, the EOC was pivotal and used as a central meeting location.

Cost: \$1.3M (SPLOST) + \$300,000 (General Fund)



Grantville Park

Grantville Park features a four-field wagon wheel that serves a variety of age groups. The park is near the Grantville Library branch and features a paved walking trail. This facility is host to youth baseball and has served as a site for many public events.

Cost: \$2M (SPLOST)



Historic Courthouse

SPLOST funds were used to help renovate the Courthouse in 2012, including full restoration of the copperwork adorning the dome, cornice, pediments and railings.

Cost: \$7,400,000 (SPLOST)



Justice Center

The Greenville Street court complex houses the District Attorney, State Court, Magistrate Court, Superior Court and the Solicitor's Office. The second building includes Juvenile Delinquency Court, Juvenile Dependency Court and Truancy/Informal/Traffic Court.

Cost: \$42M (SPLOST)



LeRoy Johnson Park

The New Leroy Johnson Park Complex Phase I was completed in June of 2018. The 46-acre park features four baseball fields and two multi use fields, as well as a walking trail. This park replaced the former park located on Howard Rd. This complex serves as the home site for one of the counties largest baseball programs.

Cost: \$4M (SPLOST)



Madras Community Center & Park

Madras Park and Community Center was completed in the Fall of 2021. This facility once served as a school and the Coweta County BOE office for a short time before being used as storage and falling into disrepair. Coweta County acquired the property around 2014 via a land swap with the Coweta BOE. The park features a community center with a large assembly area, kitchen, two multimedia classrooms, and an art room. A gymnasium, walking trail, outdoor fitness equipment, playground, and pavilion.

Cost: \$2.4M (SPLOST)



Newnan Bypass Expansion

The Newnan Bypass was extended from Turkey Creek Road to GA-16 East. This project was ongoing using 2002, 2007 and 2013 SPLOST funds.

Cost: \$6.2M



Nixon Road Paving

Paving Nixon Road, which was formerly a gravel road, was a project under SPLOST 2007 and 2013.

Cost: \$800,000 (Phase I) and \$1.3M (Phase II) for Total of \$2.1M



Poplar Road Interchange

SPLOST funds, in addition to funds from GDOT, helped to create the I-85 Interchange on Poplar Road, Exit 44, creating a 6th interchange in Coweta County.

Cost: \$2.8M (Impact Fees) and \$11.3M (SPLOST) for \$14.1M Total



Sheriff's Office

SPLOST provided funds for a Video Visitation Center and Infirmarium for the Sheriff's Office.

Cost:

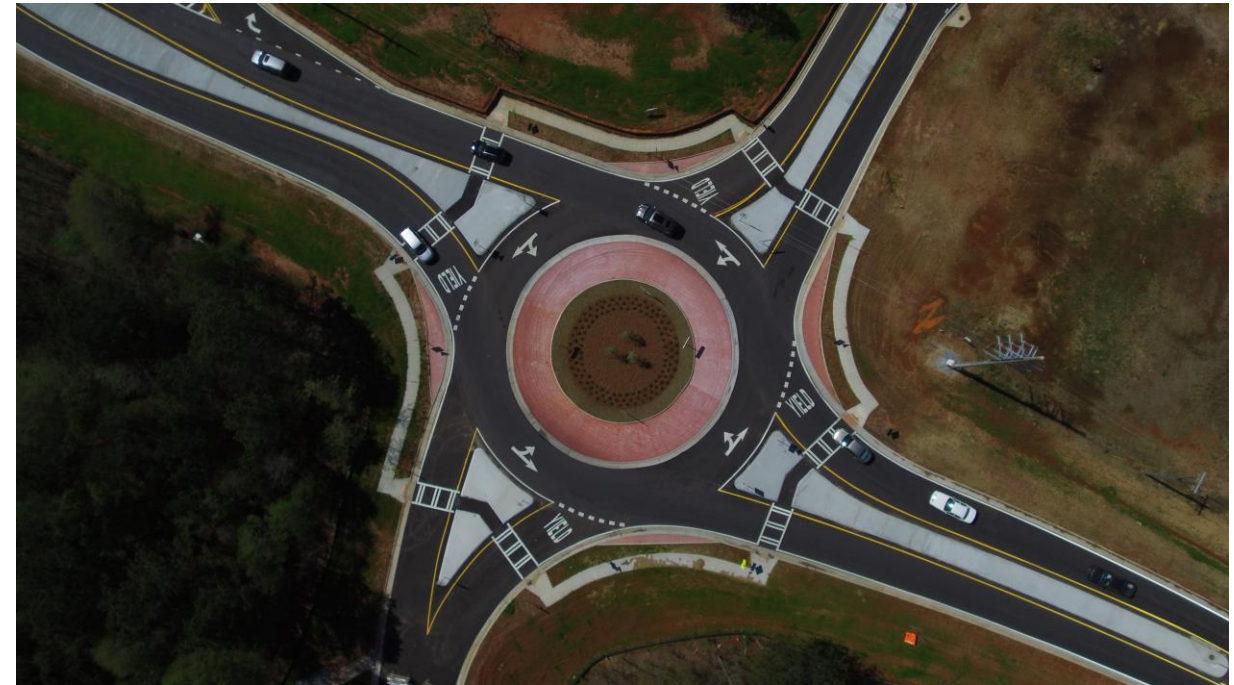
- Eastside Precinct: \$300,000 (SPLOST)
- Video Visitation: \$2.6M (SPLOST)



SR-16 and Old Highway 85 Roundabout

The roundabout that was built at SR 16 and Old 85 was a joint venture between the County and the developer of the property in the southeast corner of the intersection. The engineering and right of way were provided by the developer. The developer is also required to make a \$250,000 contribution toward the cost of the construction before the certificate of occupancy is issued for the store.

Cost: \$1.29M less developer contribution of \$250,000 = \$1M SPLOST



Tornado Sirens

(22) sirens throughout the County and (8) sirens in the City of Newnan. Installed near schools, parks, and other locations where large groups gather outside. Approximate coverage of 1.25 miles depending on topography and nearby development.

Cost: \$400,000 (SPLOST) + \$230,000 (Grants)



Welcome Park

Welcome Park renovations began in the Fall of 2022. Originally this site featured a softball field that was in disrepair. With greenspace areas being a priority for the citizens of Coweta County, the park was renovated to include a walking trail, outdoor fitness equipment, playground, and large greenspace area. Coweta County intends to construct a pavilion in 2023.

Cost: \$160,000 (SPLOST)
